One: God never forgets God's promises. God's covenant endures in each new generation. We are free to speak the truth about our lives because God's faithfulness embraces us as we examine our hearts.

God of mercy, we confess that we fail to recognize that when we deny our own belovedness, we deny the belovedness of others. We also fail to recognize that when we deny the belovedness of others, we deny our own belovedness too.

Silent prayer of confession

God of mercy, turn us back to you. Help us to embrace your love for us so that we might live fully into our identity as your beloved children. Help us to embrace your love for others, so that they, too, may live fully into their identity as beloved. Help us to remember the depth and breadth of your love for all your creation and to live our lives in the fullness of your presence and the sharing of your love.

Silent prayer of commitment (Amen)
